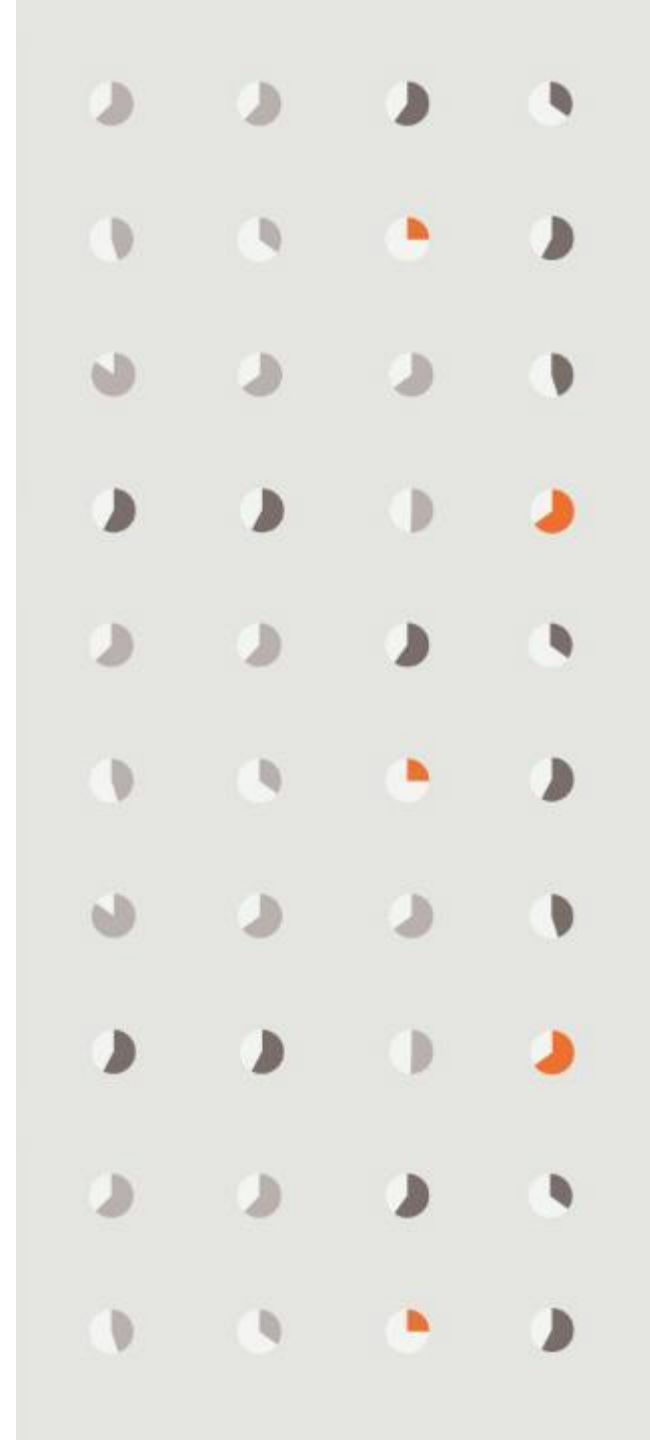
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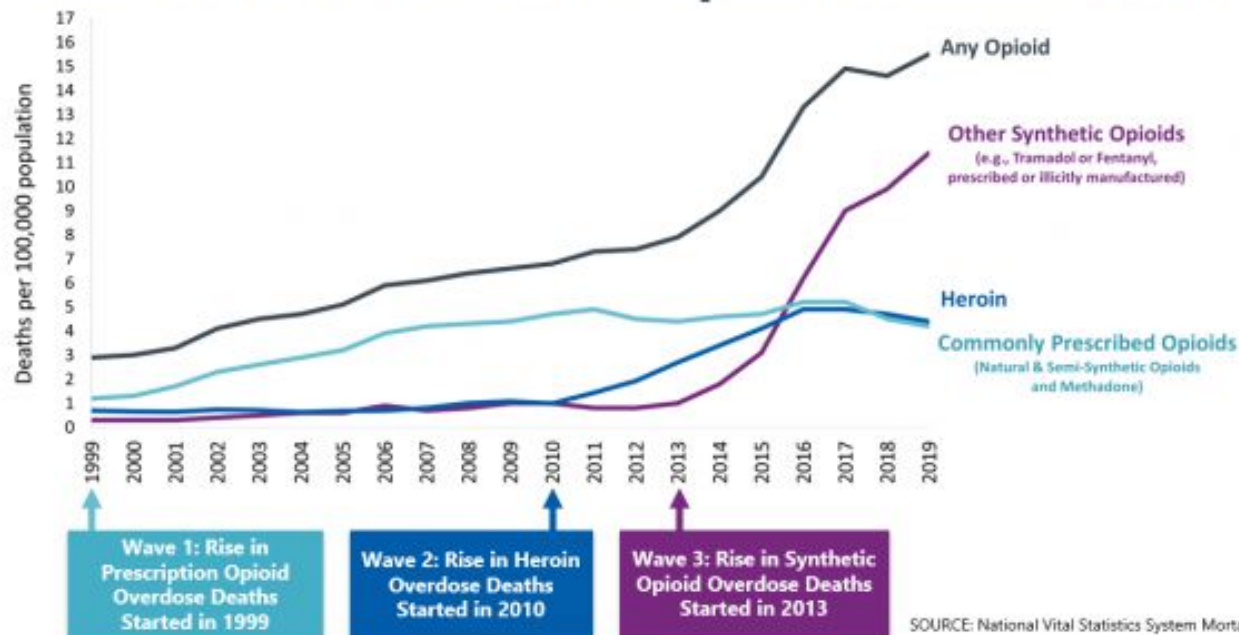

Background

The number of drug overdose deaths has quadrupled since 1999. In 2019, 70,630 drug overdose deaths occurred in the United States.

What are Substance Use Disorder and Opioid Use Disorder?

Substance Use Disorder

- A medical illness caused by disordered use of a substance or substances. According to the Fifth Edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM-5), SUDs are characterized by clinically significant impairments in health, social function, and impaired control over substance use and are diagnosed through assessing cognitive, behavioral, and psychological symptoms. An SUD can range from mild to severe.

Opioid Use Disorder

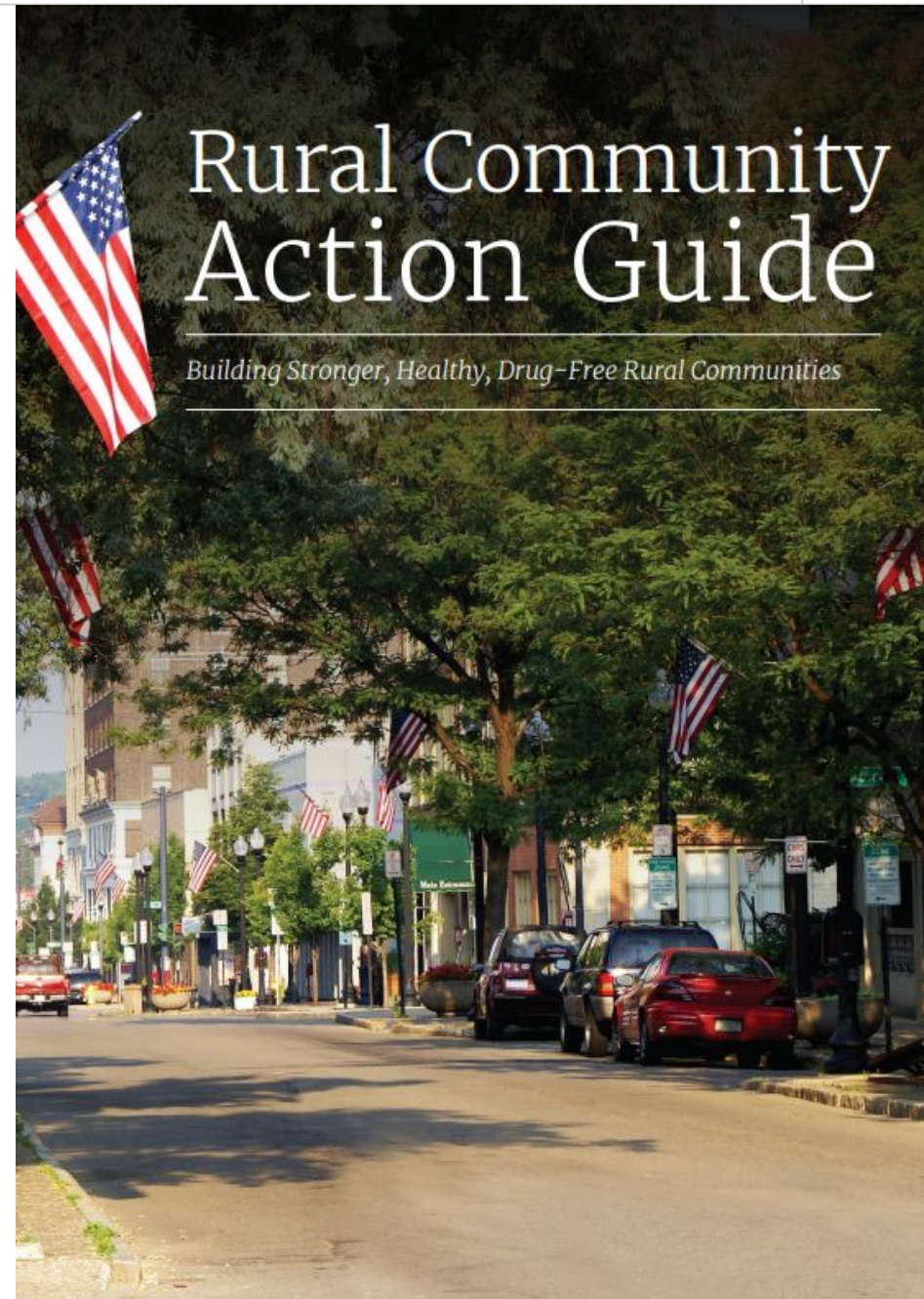
- A problematic pattern of opioid use that causes significant impairment or distress.

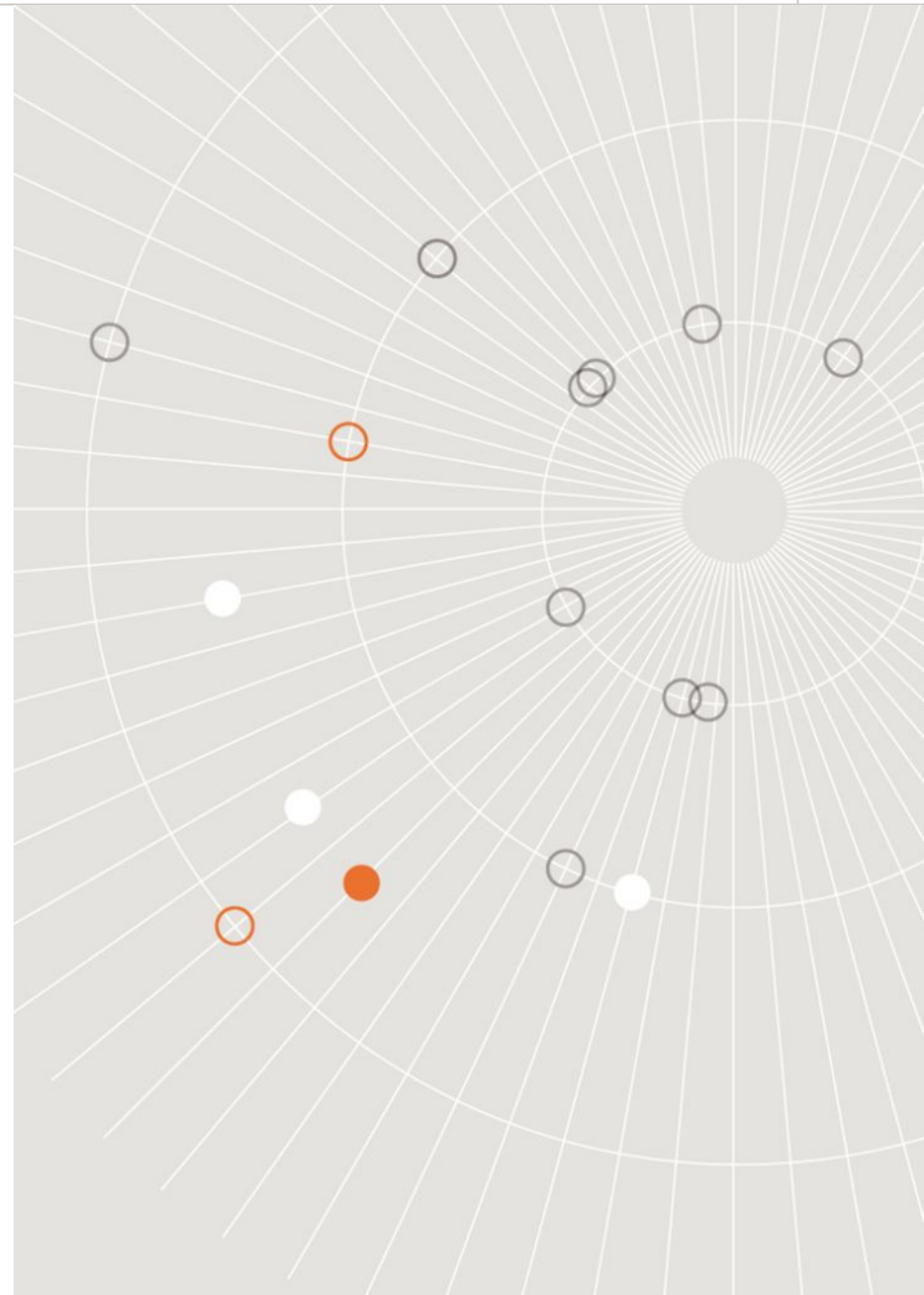
- The *Rural Community Action Guide* provides topical insights on how rural leaders can and are addressing drug use and its consequences to build strong and healthy rural places.

Action Steps to Help Build Effective Rural Drug Courts

1. Provide ample access to training, including the psychopharmacology of addiction, substance misuse treatment, behavior modification, and drug court policies and procedures.
2. Identify creative ways to fill resource gaps.
3. Encourage community engagement and community buy-in.

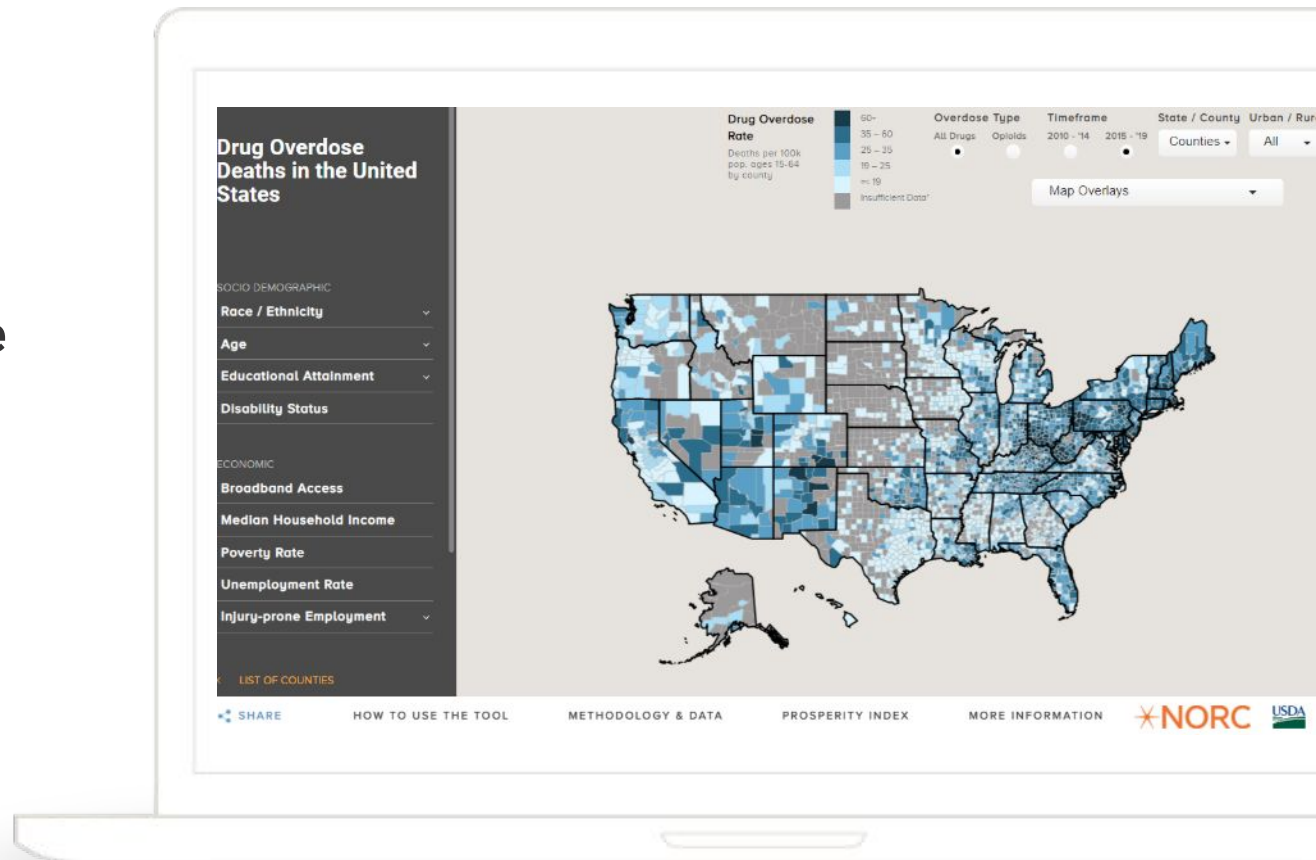
Action Steps to Use Community Data Better

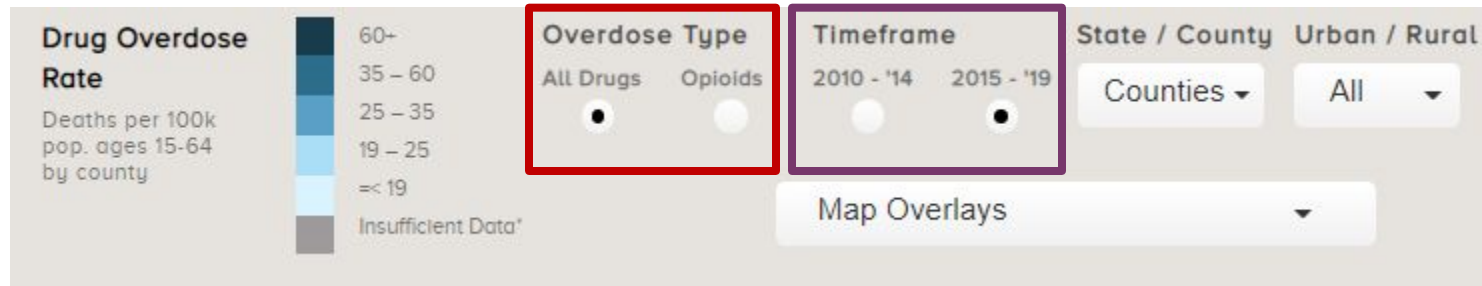

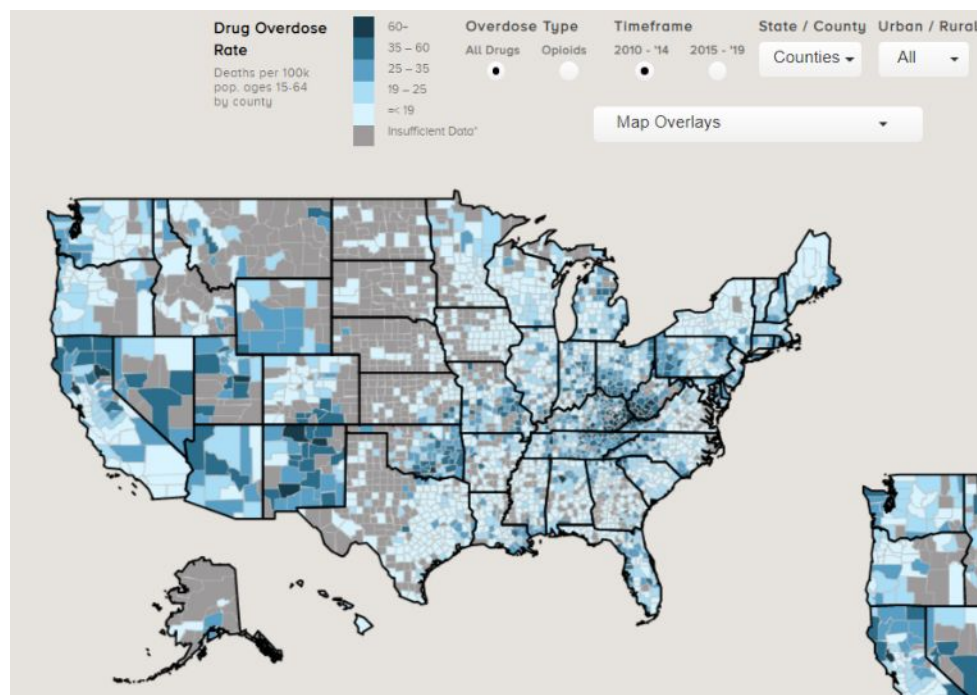

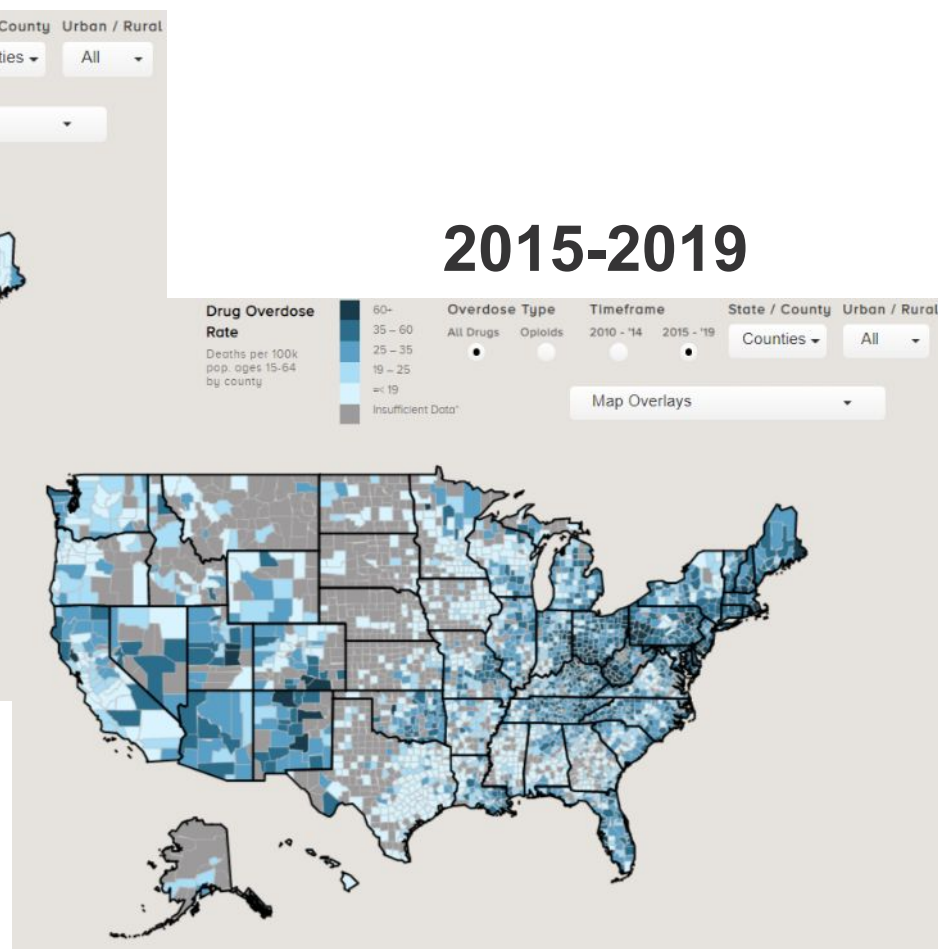

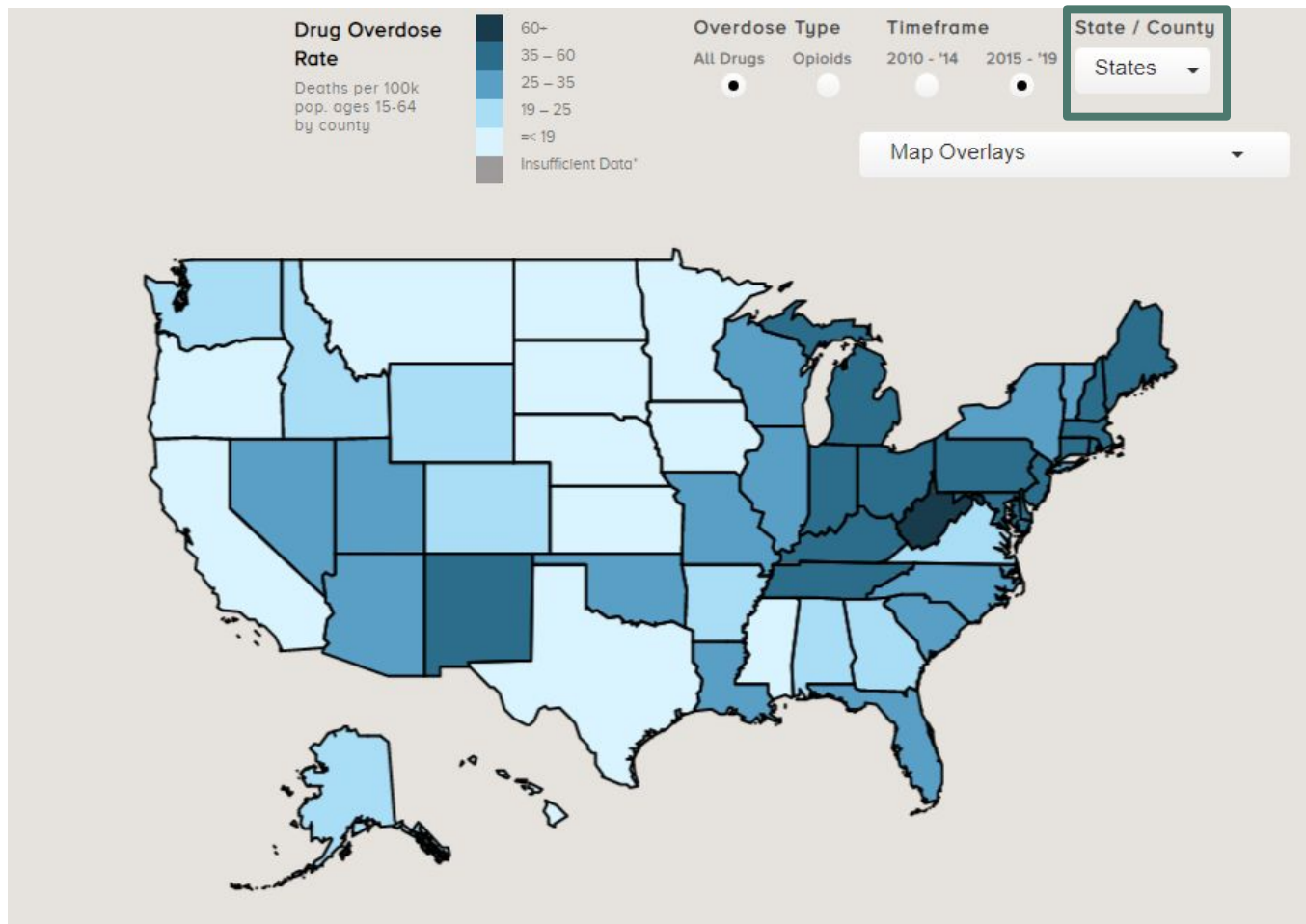

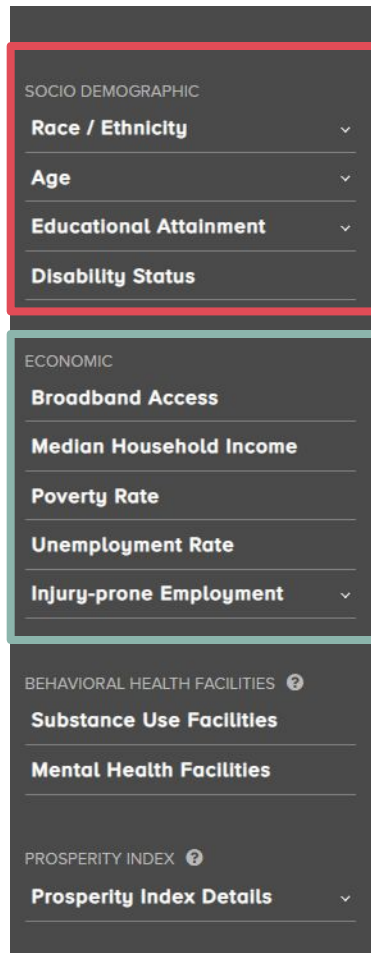

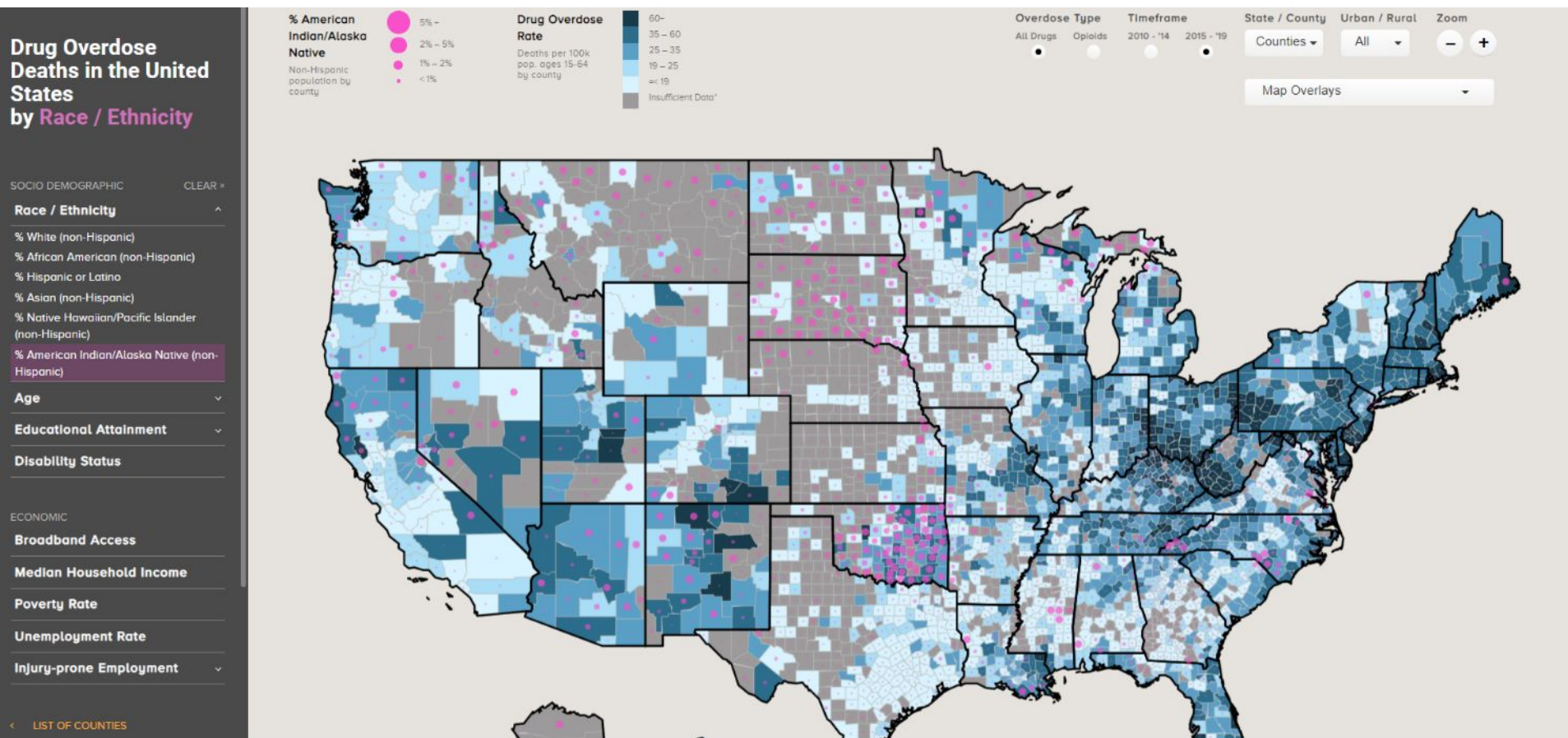

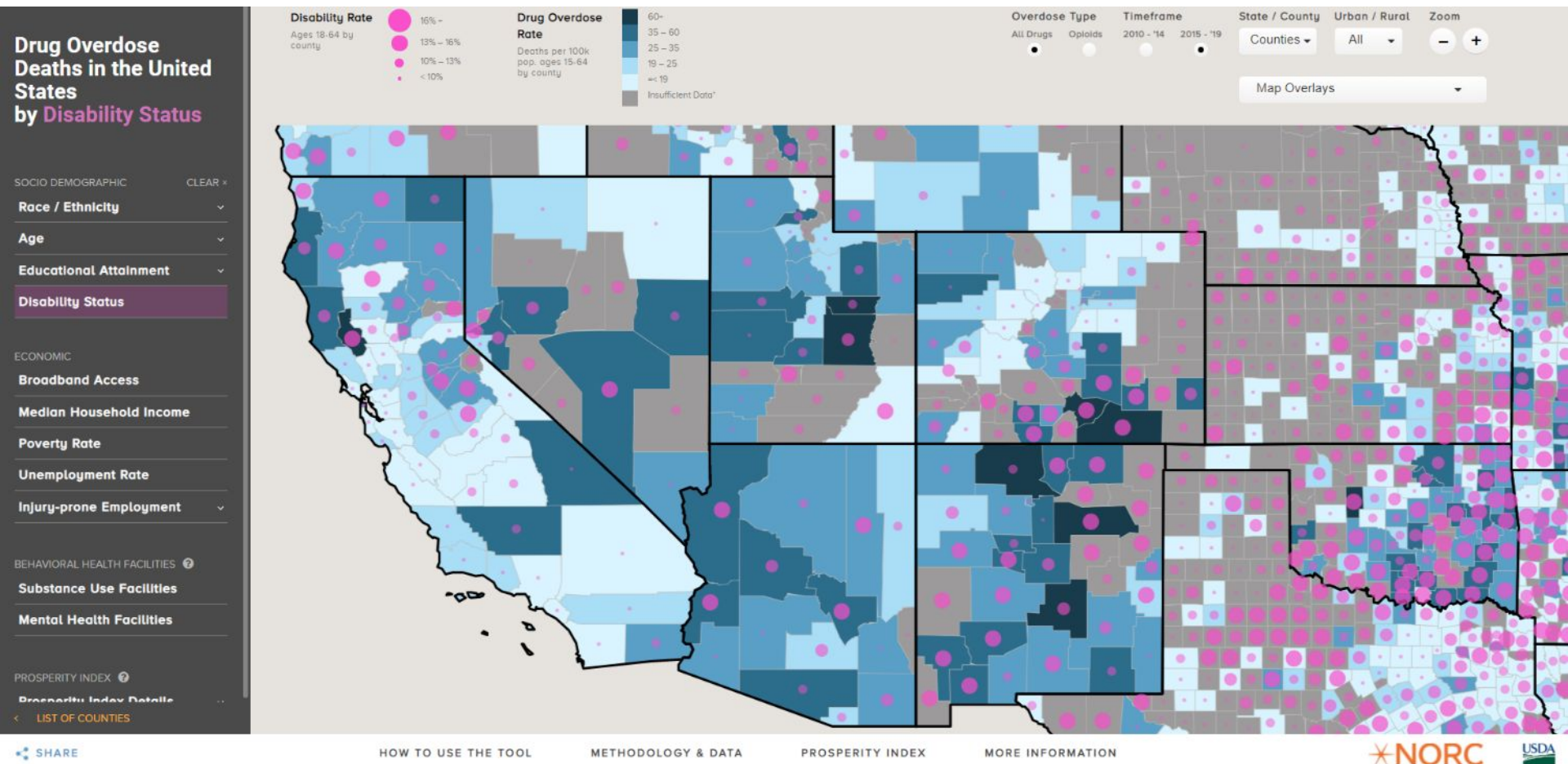

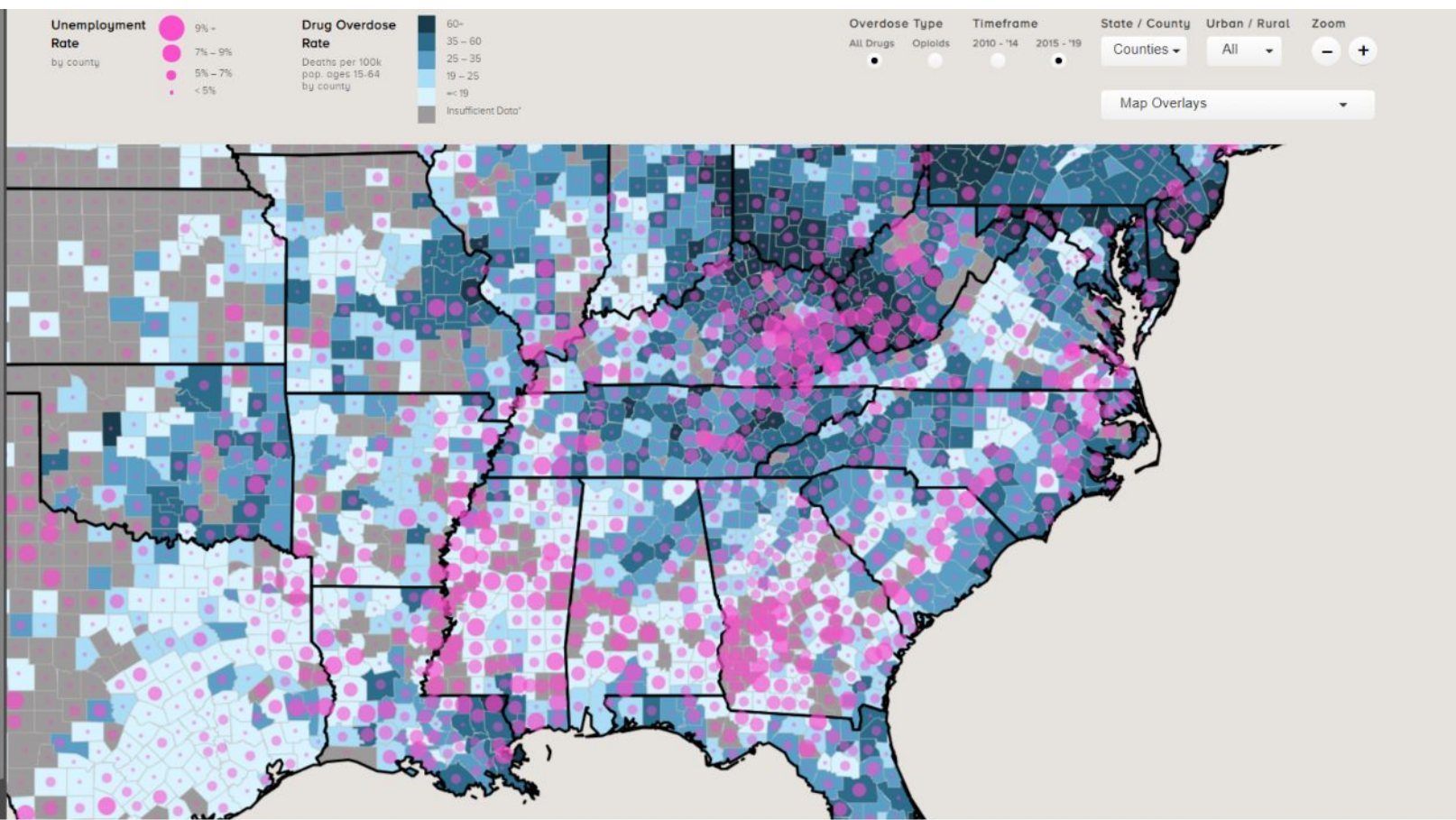

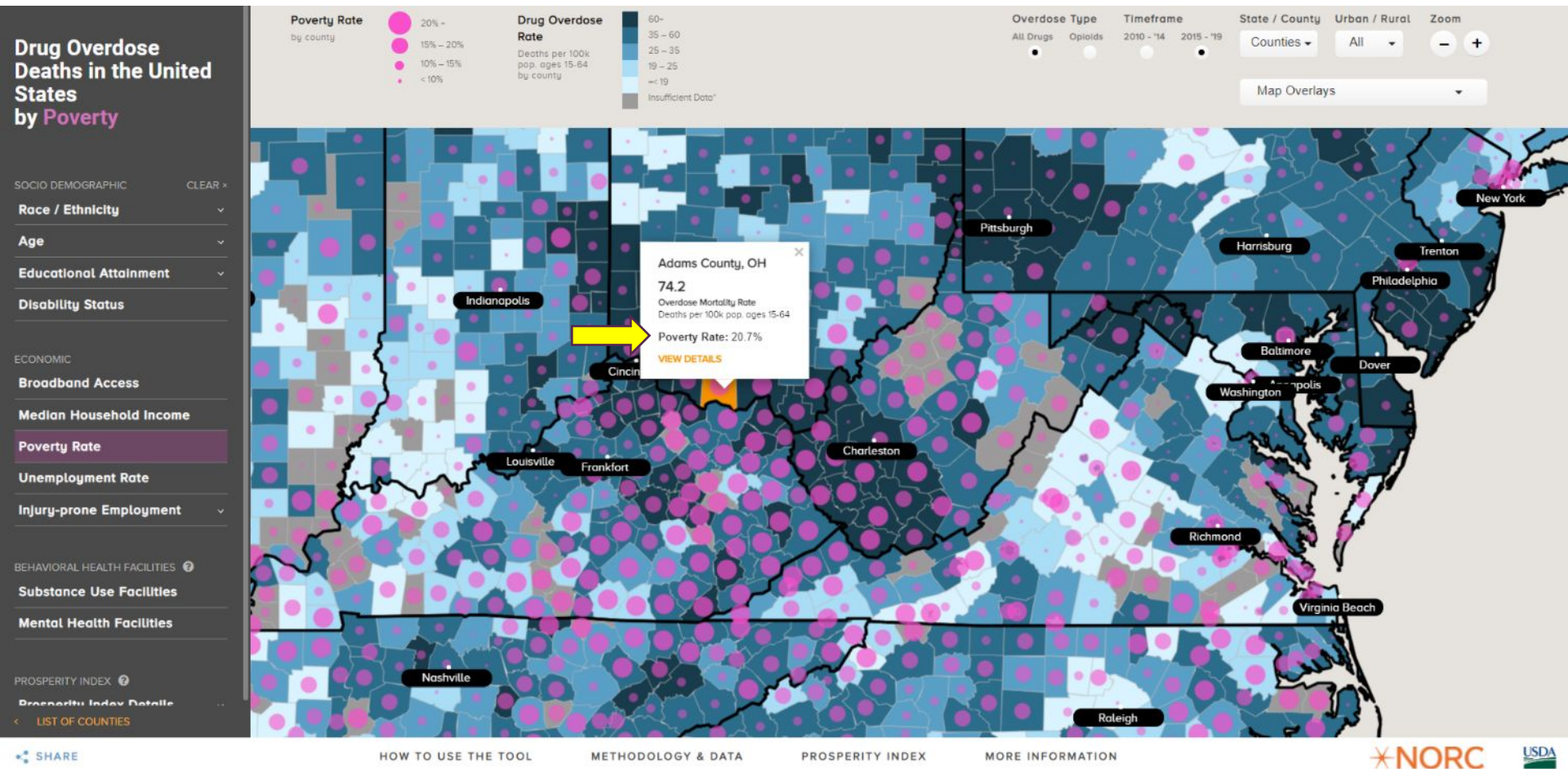

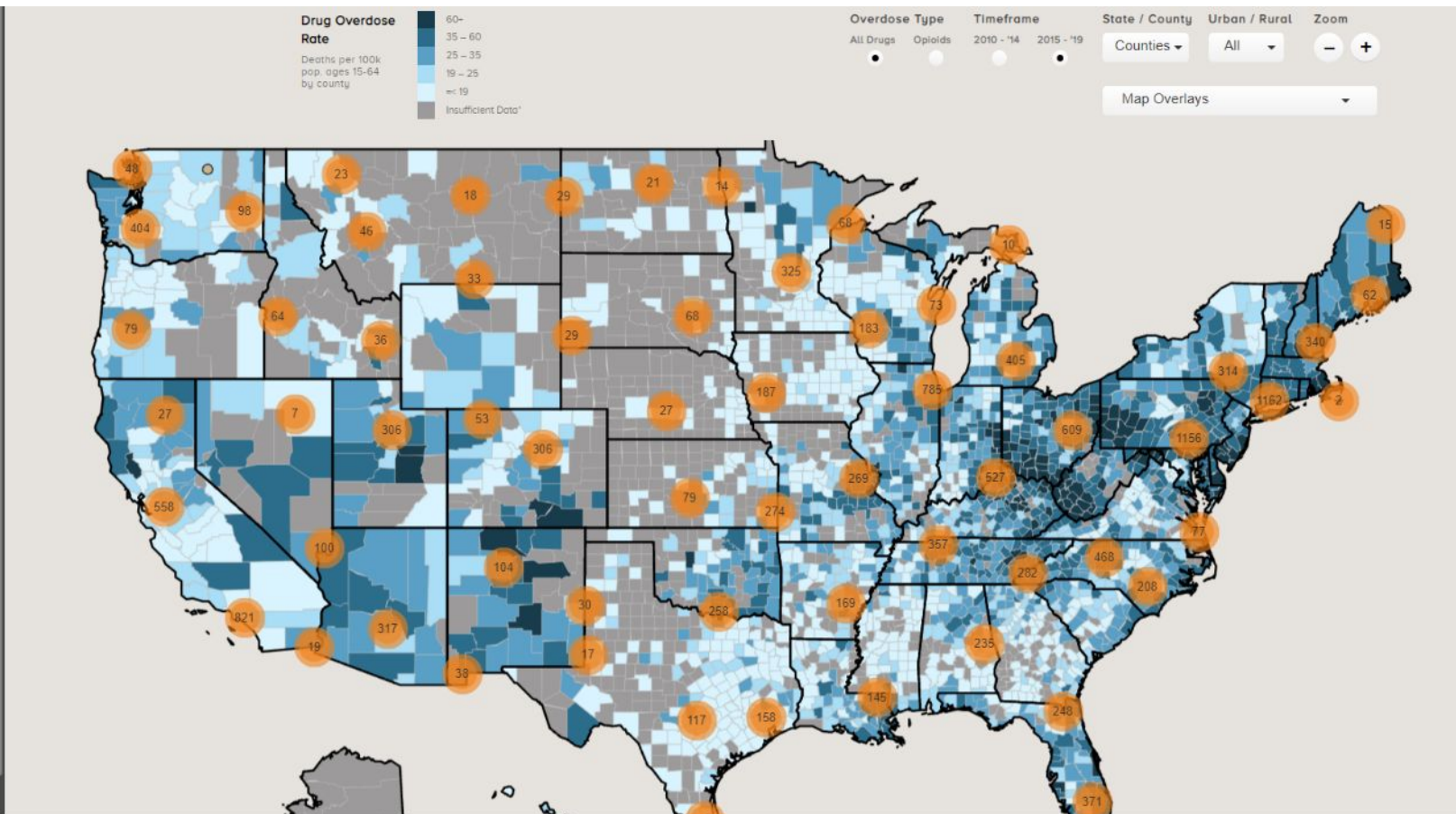

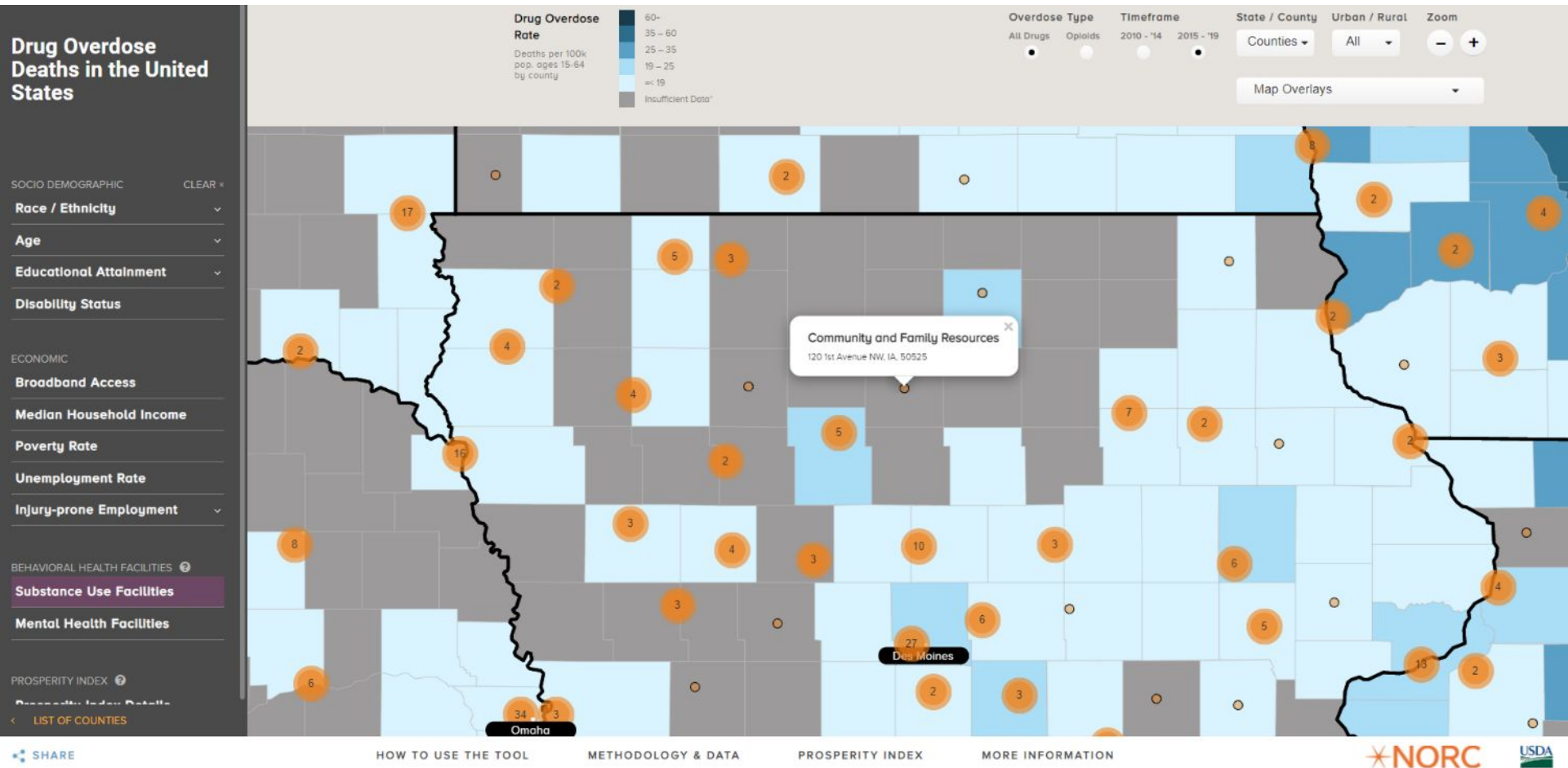

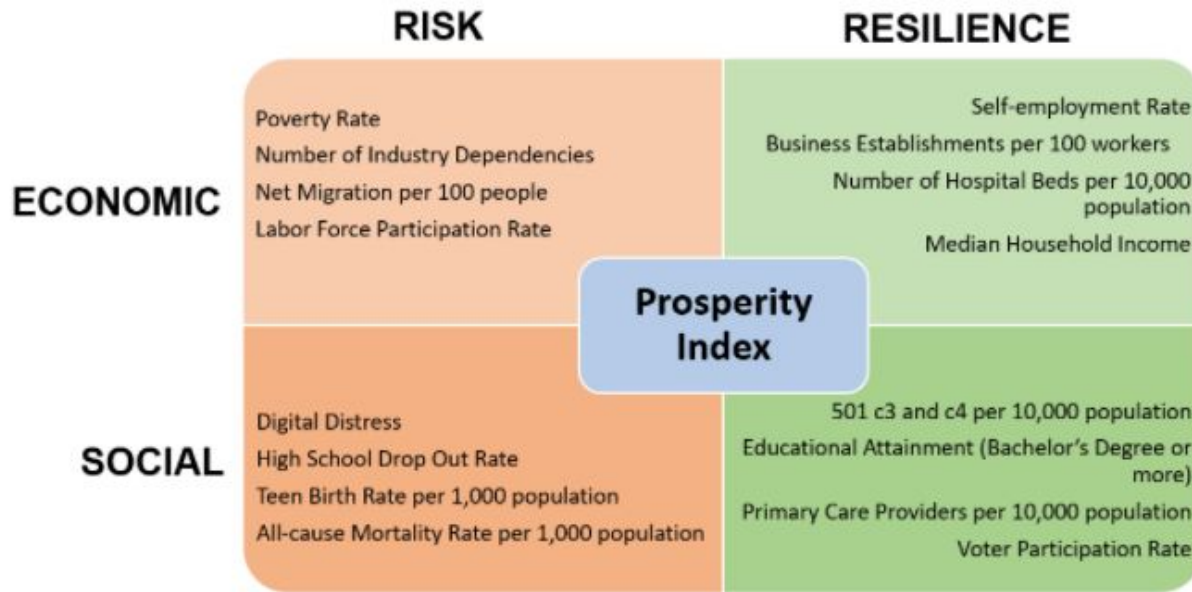
The **prosperity index** was developed with funding from USDA Rural Development.

- What does a community need to have in place to be prosperous or what takes away from prosperity?

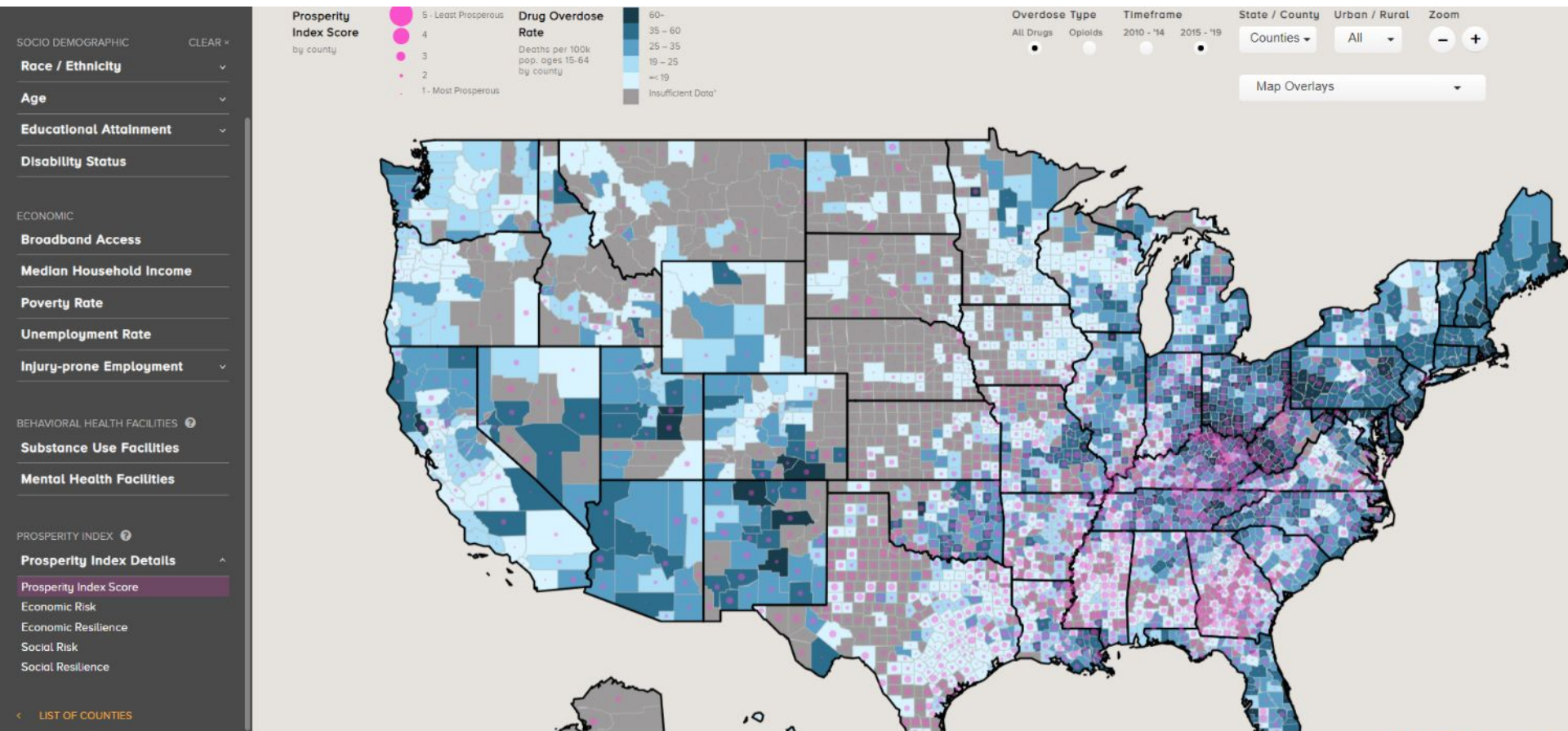


The prosperity index includes data from 16 indicators.



The prosperity index provides a single numerical measure designed to reflect the prosperity of a county.
